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Removing sweat glands

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What are the sweaty glands? The glands are cables that produce sweat and are transferred to the external surface of the body (leather). Since we persist the sweat glands releases the sweat that makes our body temperature to remain in a cool normal level. To maintain such a type of stability, sweat glands spreads on all our parts of the body -Genita parts, lips, hands and neck etc. Every individual has more than 2 million sweaty glands. There are two types of sweaty glands and these are: expressed glands: the acranz glands are the most widespread type of sweaty glands. They can be detected throughout the body. Especially in our front, palms of the hand, feet and neck. ApoCrine glands: the apocrine glands are usually located in areas that have hair-under weapons, external genital parts and around the anus. This sweat is produced when a person is going through an emotional stress. Excision of the Southominal Gland: under the process of exciting the sweat gland, the skin area (which is influenced by excessive sweating) is surgically removed as well as the sweat gland. In this process of removing the sweat gland the wounds are sewn closed (with small points,) The healing of the can take a long time and after surgery the great signs are left behind. Treatment of sympathetic nervous system: The third procedure for removing the sweat gland is the treatment of the sympathetic nervous system. In this procedure, sympathetic nervous system activity issuing anaesthesia. Then, a 5 mm incision on each side of the rib cage is made by the surgeon. After the endoscopy, a camera is inserted into the nervous system, known as Transtoraic Endoscopic Simpatectomy (ETS).The procedure lasts 60 minutes and the wounds are stitched.
